**Background:** Located in Carlisle, Pa, Carlisle Barracks is in Cumberland County. Approximately 400 acres in size, the mission of this U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command-managed installation includes support to the U.S. Army War College and other assigned agencies. A total of 1,680 personnel are employed or stationed at the installation. Approximately 1,700 family members reside in installation housing.

Established in 1757, Carlisle Barracks is the second oldest Army post in the United States. Carlisle Barracks has been a Colonial munitions post, an American Revolution prisoner of war camp for Hessian soldiers, the pre-Civil War U.S. Army Cavalry School, and the Carlisle Indian Industrial School. Since 1951, it has been the home of the U.S. Army War College, U.S. Army Military History Institute, General Omar N. Bradley Museum, and the Hessian Powder Museum.
