
TYPE OF PROJECT: Streambank and Shoreline Erosion Protection of Public Works and Non-Profit Public Services

CONTRIBUTION TO CHESAPEAKE BAY: Directly contributes to achieving protection and restoration goals established by the 2009 Executive Order 13508 and the 2014 Chesapeake Bay Program Agreement by restoring clean water.

Village of Afton, Chenango County, NY

BACKGROUND: The Village of Afton is located in southern Chenango County, NY along the Susquehanna River. It lies equidistant between the cities of Oneonta and Binghamton along the Interstate 88 corridor. The village has a total area of approximately 1.6 square miles, of which 1.5 square miles is land and 0.08 square miles is water.

The erosion of the bank of the Susquehanna River has progressed to a line of mature trees that are currently securing the bank near the Rt. 41 bridge. If this erosion continues, the trees will topple into the river, endangering Riverside Drive, the Village water main and eventually the Rt. 41 state highway bridge and homes long Riverside Drive.

STATUS: A Federal Interest Determination (FID) Report is being prepared to determine federal interest in implementing a solution to this problem. If the FID is approved, the Baltimore District will develop a Project Management Plan to aid in the negotiation and execution of a Feasibility Cost Sharing Agreement (FCSA).

² The final FY 2015 allocation amounts will be made available upon final approval pursuant to the Energy and Water Appropriations Act's continuing funding requirements.


SCHEDULE:
