Background: Located near Chambersburg, Letterkenny Army Depot (LEAD) is in Franklin County and within the 9th Congressional District. Approximately 19,243 acres in size, LEAD is the number one provider of Air Defense and Tactical Missile System support to the Department of Defense (DoD) and foreign allies. LEAD is DoD's only organic solution for one-stop service for tactical missile maintenance, modification and integration. A total of 2,030 civilian, contractor and military personnel are employed at the installation.



Letterkenny Army Depot has served our Nation for more than 61 years. On October 15, 1942, the first nine railroad cars of small arms ammunition arrived on the depot. By December 31, 1942, over 1,707 box-car loads of ammunition were in storage. Over three million tons of ammunition were shipped during World War II.
