### **Corps Continues to Prepare for Upcoming Investigation in Spring Valley**

**BALTIMORE, MD**--The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Baltimore District, continue to prepare the property on Glenbrook Road where the Corps will conduct a planned intrusive investigation later this month.

Workers continue to build the metal vapor containment structure and install monitoring and filter systems over the area where Army Ordnance Specialists will dig by hand to investigate for any remnants of the former American University Experiment Station.

According to Corps officials, the investigation is expected to take about eight weeks to complete. If any chemical warfare materials are found during the investigation, the materials will be packed in approved containers and safely removed from the site.

In addition to preparing the Glenbrook Road property, the Corps is continuing to prepare the federal property behind Sibley Hospital, which will be used to support the Corps' investigation.
