Infrared deer survey to be conducted at Raystown Lake

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Raystown Lake will conduct a third deer survey Wednesday through Sunday, Nov. 23-27. A helicopter, operated by Helicopter Applicators Inc., will fly transects across the Corps' property at an elevation of about 600 feet to assess numbers and location of deer using infrared technology.

The information gathered will assist the Corps in their continued program to better manage the deer herd in balance with the habitat. The survey will last between eight and 10 hours and may occur during daylight hours or overnight depending on conditions for surveying.
