### **Recreation areas to open to Canada goose hunting**

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Raystown Lake is announcing the opening of the following areas to Canada Goose Hunting: Tatman Run Beach Area, Aitch Recreation Area and Weaver Falls Recreation Area. Portions of these areas will be closed, except for the purpose of hunting Canada Geese. The boat launch at Aitch will remain open, with Canada Goose hunting permitted along fields to the south of the entrance road. The beach areas at Tatman Run and Seven Points are officially closed during this period each year; however, this release provides public notice that hunting for Canada Goose will be permitted.

All areas listed above will be open during the late Canada Goose season from Dec. 9 – Feb. 15. The Corps will provide signs designating hunting and restricted areas. All other areas around the lake are also open to public hunting during the scheduled waterfowl seasons established by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service provided proper safety zone regulations and posted restrictions are followed.

Hunters participating in hunting activities at the Raystown Lake Project must strictly adhere to all Pennsylvania Game Commission regulations, applicable U.S. Fish and Wildlife regulations, as well as any special regulations posted by the Corps.
