Raystown Lake announces hunting road openings

HESSTON, Pa. — The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Raystown Lake will be opening access roads for the early firearms seasons and fall turkey season:

- The following roads will open from Oct. 13-20 to accommodate the state-wide fall antlerless muzzleloading season and the three day firearms season for junior, senior, disabled and active duty hunters:
 - The Susquehannock Campground Road (Gate 8), just off Bakers Hollow Road in Penn Township; High Germany Road (Gate 28–Nancy’s Camp Service Road); the Miller farm area near Weavers Falls recreation area (Gate 35); the Upper Corners Road near Seven Points (Gate 13); John Bum Road (Gate 27); and Hawn Road (Gate 1) will be
- The following roads will open Oct. 27-Nov. 12 to accommodate the fall turkey season:
 - The Susquehannock Campground Road (Gate 8) and High Germany Road (Gate 28–Nancy’s Camp Service Road).

The Corps may close or choose not to open these gated roads depending on weather, road conditions or special activities such as logging operations. Other hunters, such as those pursuing small game or archery hunting opportunities, may also use the roads for vehicle access during these road openings.

There is no off-season maintenance on these roadways; vehicle operators will be traveling at their own risk. All Pennsylvania Game Commission and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers regulations apply. Additional road and gate openings will be announced for the regular firearms seasons.
