## **Major Patrick J. Dagon** **Deputy District Engineer for Support Operations**

Major Patrick J. Dagon became the Deputy District Engineer for Support Operations in August 2007. His previous assignment was with the Baltimore District as the Deputy Resident Engineer at Fort Myer, Va.

Dagon is from Butler, Ill., and graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1996. Upon completion of the Engineer Officer Basic Course, he served with the 23rd Engineer Battalion in Friedberg, Germany, as a Platoon Leader in A Company and deployed to Bosnia in 1997. He also served as the Officer in Charge of the Mine Action Center for the Multi-National Division (North). After redeploying from Bosnia, he served as an assistant operations officer and company executive officer in the 16th Engineer Battalion.

After the Engineer Captain's Career Course, he was assigned to the 14th Combat Engineer Battalion where he served as the logistics officer and the personnel officer. He deployed to Kuwait from May until November 2001 where he served as the Combined Joint Task Force (Kuwait) Engineer. He commanded the 18th Engineer Company, 3rd Brigade, 2nd Infantry Division and deployed from November 2003 to July 2004 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Dagon earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Environmental Science from the United States Military Academy at West Point, a Masters in Public Policy Administration from the University of Missouri at St. Louis, and a Master of Science in Construction Management from the University of Washington. His military education includes the Engineer Officer Basic Course and the Engineer Captain's Career Course.

Among his military decorations are the Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, Parachutist Badge, and Air Assault Badge.
