The second line is proposed from SPLP's Delmont Station, in Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, to the Marcus Hook facility, paralleling the initial line for approximately 255 miles.

The Project will be reviewed under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (NHPA), pursuant to the Corps implementing regulations found at 33 CFR Part 325 Appendix C. Although we have not yet determined the extent of our Section 106 scope of analysis, or Permit Area, we expect that the proposed Project will impact Waters of the US (WOUS) regulated by Corps and will require authorization under Section 10 of the River and Harbors Act (33 U.S.C. Part 401 et. Seq.) and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. Part 1344).

Good afternoon everyone,

I just wanted to send you an informal email letting you know that the Baltimore District (Lead), the Philadelphia District and the Pittsburgh District have selected me to be the

Tribal Liaison for the Sunoco Pennsylvania Pipeline Project, which proposes to extend from Houston, in Washington County to the Marcus Hook Facility in Delaware County, Pennsylvania (Attachment). A letter signed by the Baltimore District Commander was just sent out today to Tribal Leaders, with a copy furnished to the Tribal Nations Section 106 Coordinators/THPOs/Cultural Directors introducing the project, which has just been formally submitted to USACE as an application for a permit.

The USACE is the Lead Federal Agency for this project; therefore, the project will be reviewed under Section 106 of the NHPA, pursuant to the USACE implementing regulations found at 33CFR325, Appendix C. At this time we have not yet determined the extent of our Section 106 scope of analysis. Also, since the proposed project will require permission for alterations to a Corps federally authorized civil works project (Raystown Lake and Loyalhanna), we are also going to be reviewing sections of the project under Section 408, using the 36CFR800 implementing regulations. I will be coordinating both efforts.

At this time, it is my understanding that a cultural resources survey, which includes both above and below ground resources, has been conducted on all high probability areas along the proposed alignment. I have been told that the reports will be submitted to me, to forward to all of you, on DVD. As soon as I receive the disks I will send them to you. Other information will be submitted for your review and comment as they are available throughout this process.

Once we have reviewed the information, I can schedule a teleconference for those who want to discuss the project and the results of the cultural resources investigation. Please feel free to contact me anytime.

Good Morning All,

I have heard from several of you, Bonney, Susan and Robin that due to prior commitments, were unable to call in to the Determination of Effects Meeting yesterday morning that was held in Harrisburg at the PHMC for sites located during investigations for the Sunoco Pennsylvania Pipeline Project (PPP).

The Determination of effects meeting is a PASHPO meeting (usually just internal to their office) and not a USACE one (so I was unable to postpone or reschedule). However, I will set up a teleconference within the next few weeks for all of us to discuss the investigations, the sites that were found, and the outcome of this meeting. I would like to hear from you regarding site eligibility, avoidance measures, and the need for further investigation.
