RESERVATIONS – NO FEE COLLECTION ON SITE

- Reservations must be made online at Recreation.gov, or by calling the toll free phone number, 877-444-6777.
- **All** changes to reservations *must* be made through Recreation.gov.
- **Length of Stay** is limited to 14 days during any 30 consecutive day period per family group.
- America the Beautiful Senior/Access discounts applied only at the time of reservation and only to the site occupied by the pass holder. Pass holder must camp with their party for entire length of reservation.

CHECK IN

- Check in is **4PM**.
- If your campsite is available before check-in time, you may proceed to reserved campsite.
- Late arrivals are permitted, as the reservation can **ONLY** be canceled by the reservation holder.
- Camping permits must be displayed on numbered site marker post.
- Maximum seven persons (or one family) per campsite.
- Maximum of **THREE** camping units per site. Two of these units must be tents.

CHECK-OUT

- The deadline for departing your campsite is **3PM**. Failure to do so may result in warning or citation.
- Remove all trash around the campsite, including the fire ring and extinguish all fire's before departure.
- Place all expired permits in the box provided at Camper Check Out.

VISITORS/CAMPING RULES

- Visitors are permitted to park on the pavement or gravel driveway at their parties reserved campsite or in a designated parking lot.
- No smoking at the beach, playground areas, inside comfort stations or amphitheater.
- Washing of vehicles, campers or RV's is prohibited.
- No digging or leveling of any ground, driving nails, cutting, defacing or tying ropes to trees or shrubs.

QUIET HOURS are 10PM to 6AM. (Generator usage during this time is prohibited)

FIRES

Fires are restricted to grills and fire rings. All fires must be completely extinguished before leaving the site.

PETS

- Pets are permitted but must be penned, caged or on a **leash** no longer than six feet in length.
- **OWNERS MUST CLEAN UP AFTER THEIR PETS.** Pet cleanup bags are provided in the Campground
- Do not leave pets unattended at your site.
- Pets are not permitted at these locations: beach, inside comfort stations, playgrounds.

VEHICLES

- No parking at unoccupied sites, along roadways or on the grass.
- All trailers and haulers must be parked on camping pad or at boat launch on the camper parking side.
- All motorized vehicles to include mobility devices must comply with state and federal highway regulations.
- **Obey all speed limits. Drive carefully and watch for children.**

ROPES IN TREES

No ropes, straps, pet leashes, etc. may be tied around trees or branches. This includes the use of Hammocks.

NOTICE

Due to electrical safety concerns, campers are prohibited from tampering with electric service to include the use of voltage meters. Campers should promptly report electrical issues to a Camp Host or Park Ranger.
