TIOGA-HAMMOND & COWANESQUE LAKES

This corridor once was part of the Erie Lackawanna Rail Line, which passed through the village of Lambs Creek. By 1979, the village and railroad were gone, and the new owner — the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers — paved the former rail line to create the Lambs Creek Hike & Bike Trail.

The trail connects the Borough of Mansfield with the Lambs Creek Recreation Area. It travels into serene, open countryside and thick growth of trees and brambles before reaching Tioga Lake. The trail is mostly flat with gentle curves.
