## Raystown Lake Seven Points Campground

Thank you for choosing Raystown Lake for your camping experience. We hope that your visit will be safe and enjoyable. The following rules are in effect to assist you during your stay. Please keep in mind that violations may result in the issuance of a citation. For a more detailed listing of project regulations, refer to the copy of Title 36 posted on the various bulletin boards throughout the project or visit the Entrance Station or Visitor Center for a copy. Any questions should be directed to a Park Ranger.

### CAMPING



1. In order to occupy a site, campers must have a reservation. Reservations can be made through the NRRS or at the Entrance Station.
2. All campers, will be issued permits upon check-in.
3. You must occupy your campsite each night. If you cannot, notify the Entrance Station.
4. You must be 18 or older to register for a site. The site holder is responsible for the actions of those at their site.
5. Camping is allowed only on designated sites. Camping permits cannot be transferred to other persons or units.
6. Each campsite is allowed 10 persons (including visitors) and two camping units, one of which must be a tent (except Meadow Camp).
7. Sites in Meadow Camp (44-59 and 68-86) are Buddy Sites. A total of 15 persons and two wheeled units are permitted on these sites. Each unit may have a tent. Only two vehicles may be parked on the site at a time.
8. Remove all of your camping equipment from the campground when you check out.
9. Refunds are available for any paid and unused nights. All refunds will be processed by NRRS and will be refunded in the same form as original payment. Cash payments will be refunded in the form of a check and may take up to six weeks to process. Please notify the Entrance Station if you depart early.

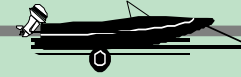

9. Check-out time is 4:00 p.m.  
Check-in time is 5:00 p.m.

10. Universal access shower and restrooms are available in Point and Senoia. Visit the Entrance Station during hours of operation for information.

### BOATS

For the convenience of our campers with boats, but not camped on a lake-front site, an overnight boat mooring pass may be obtained from the Entrance Station, Ranger Office, or by a Park Ranger. This will permit you to moor your boat along the shoreline in Twin Hollows and in the area north of the Seven Points Launch. The mooring pass must be displayed so that it can be seen from the shoreline. You may not sleep in your boat overnight.



### VEHICLES



1. All vehicles in the campground must have a pass.
2. Each campsite may be issued a maximum of 2 camper vehicle passes and 1 visitor pass. It is the responsibility of the site holder to manage passes issued to their site.
3. You are allowed to park **only 2** registered vehicles on your campsite. Auxiliary parking lots are available for additional vehicles.
4. Vehicles that are not issued passes will not be allowed in the campgrounds. These vehicles should be parked in the **Mushroom** parking area, or in one of the day use area parking lots.
5. Do not park vehicles on the grass or along the roadways. Boat trailers may be parked on the grass at your site.

### VISITORS

All visitors to the campground must obtain a visitor pass for their vehicle from the campsite to whom they are visiting. Visitor passes are valid until 10 p.m. daily, until the date of expiration. *It is especially important that visitors leaving a site and not returning, return their pass to the site holder. Only one visitor pass per campsite will be issued for the duration of a stay.* Vehicles without a pass, should be parked in the Mushroom parking area, on in one of the day use area parking lots.



### SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS



1. Quiet hours are from 10:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. Excessive noise that unreasonably disturbs other campers is prohibited at all times.
2. Do not cut standing dead or green trees. You may use wood that is dead and down. Lanterns are not to be hung so as to damage trees or limbs. Nails, axes, etc. are not to be driven into trees.
3. Camp and cook fires must be confined to grills and fireplaces. Don't leave your fire unattended. Put it out completely before leaving the campground.
4. Dogs, cats, and other pets must be kept on a leash (six feet or less), caged or physically restrained. Pets are not allowed in public buildings.
  - Don't place chains around trees.
  - Don't leave your pet unattended at your site, in your unit, or vehicle. Loud and continuous barking will not be tolerated.
  - Clean up after your pet.
5. All fireworks are prohibited. Loaded firearms and other projectile firing devices are not allowed in campgrounds.
6. Keep your site clean and free of trash and litter. Deposit all trash in area dumpsters prior to departure. Remove all refuse from your grills before your leave. Liquid waste such as gray water are to be disposed of at the dump station. Do not wash dishes or other articles at the water fountains, hydrants, or in the sinks in the restrooms.

Extra trash bags are available at the Entrance Station and the Visitors Center or from a Park Ranger.
