Nancy's Boat to Shore Campground Rules and Regulations

Thank you for choosing Raystown Lake for your camping experience. We hope that your visit will be safe and enjoyable. The following rules are in effect to assist you during your stay. Please keep in mind that violations may result in the issuance of a citation. For a more detailed listing of project regulations, refer to the copy of Title 36 posted on the various bulletin boards throughout the project or visit the Entrance Station or Visitor Center for a copy. 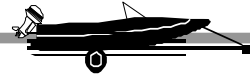


CAMPING

1. Obtain a registration envelope from the box located near the bulletin board and follow the directions that are provided there.
2. You must have your camping equipment with you when you register for your site. Campsites must be occupied each night. If you cannot, notify a Ranger. Your camping equipment is to be set up on your site within 2 hours of registration.
3. To register for a campsite, you must be at least 18 years old. The site holder is responsible for the actions of those at their site.
4. Camping is allowed only at one of the fifty designated sites. Display the stub portion of your registration envelope on the numbered post at your site. This permit cannot be transferred to other persons or units.

5. Each campsite is allowed a total of 10 persons (including your visitors) and two camping units. Current fees are posted at the bulletin board.
6. You must remove all of your camping equipment from the campground when you check out.
7. Check-out time is 5:00 p.m.
8. Camping fees are refundable only under limited circumstances, however you are entitled to a voucher for any paid and unused nights. You may obtain these at the Ranger Office located in the Seven Points Visitor Center. Vouchers are redeemable only at Raystown Lake.

BOATS



You may not sleep in your boat overnight.

VEHICLES



1. Boat launch parking lots are routinely patrolled, however you should remove all valuables and remove equipment from your vehicle. Other valuable items should be placed out of sight.
2. User Fees are not charged for public boat launching for Nancy's Camp campers. You are to place a registration stub on your dashboard marked as "Nancy's Camp". An empty envelope with your license number and dates of stay indicated should be placed in the vault.



VISITORS

Campground visitors hours are from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.



SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS

1. **Quiet hours are from 10:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.** Excessive noise that unreasonably disturbs other campers is prohibited at all times.
2. Do not cut standing dead or green trees. You may use wood that is dead and down. Lanterns are not to be hung so as to damage trees or limbs. Nails, axes, etc. are not to be driven into trees.
3. Camp and cook fires must be confined to grills and fireplaces. Don't leave your fire unattended. Put it out completely before leaving the campground.
4. Dogs, cats, and other pets must be kept on a leash (six feet or less), caged or physically restrained. Pets are not allowed in public buildings.
 - Don't place chains around trees.
 - Don't leave your pet unattended at your site, in your unit, or vehicle. Loud and continuous barking will not be tolerated.
 - Clean up after your pet.
5. All fireworks are prohibited. Loaded firearms and other projectile firing devices are not allowed in campgrounds.
6. Keep your site free of trash and litter and clean it prior to departure. Remove all refuse from your grills before you leave. Do not wash dishes or other articles at the water pump.

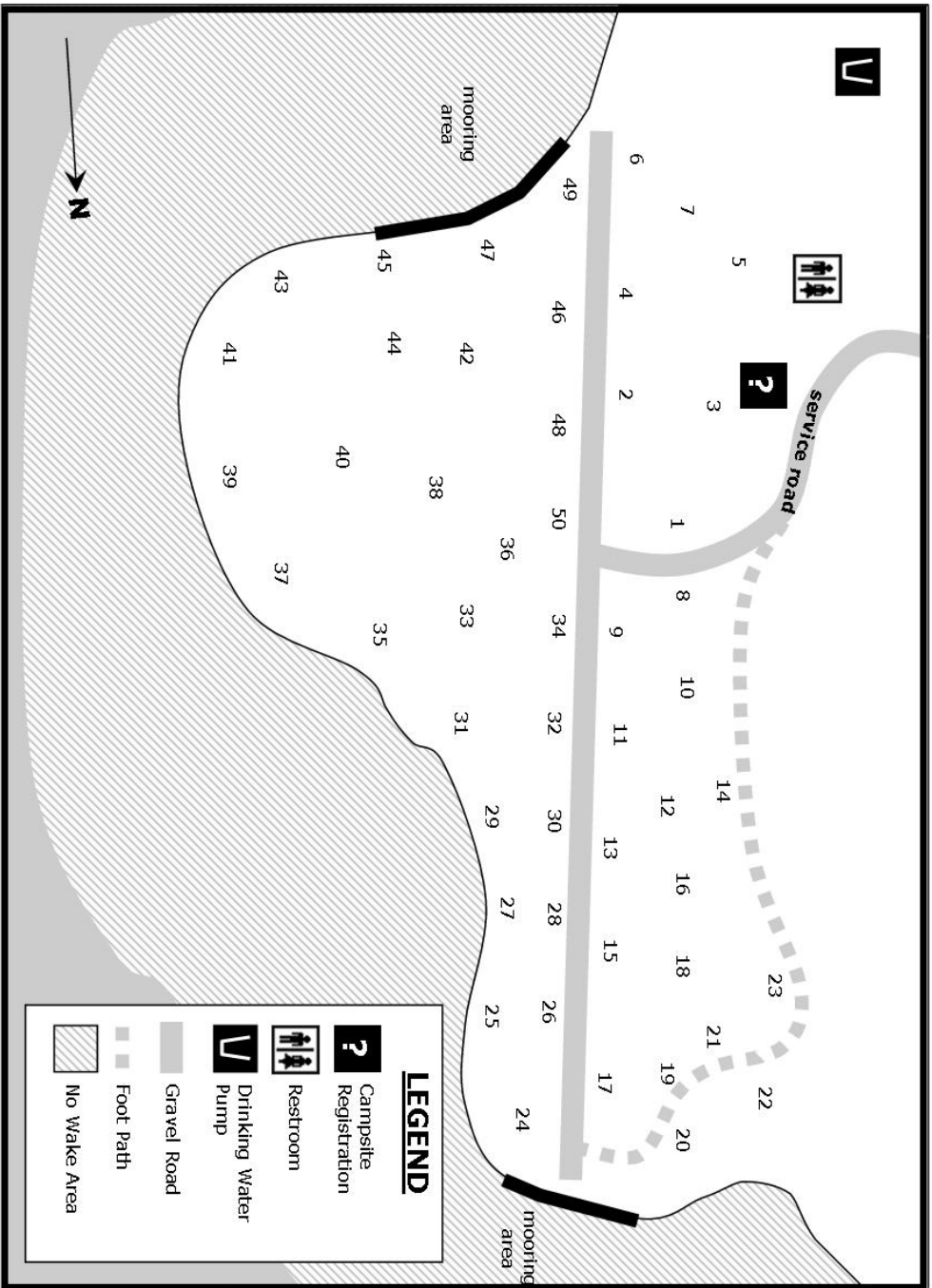
