# MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Approved Jurisdictional Determination in accordance with the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'"; (88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) as amended by the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming" (8 September 2023), 1 NAB-2024-00142-M46 (Downsville Solar II/Approved JD).2

BACKGROUND. An Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) is a Corps document stating the presence or absence of waters of the United States on a parcel or a written statement and map identifying the limits of waters of the United States on a parcel. AJDs are clearly designated appealable actions and will include a basis of JD with the document.<sup>3</sup> AJDs are case-specific and are typically made in response to a request. AJDs are valid for a period of five years unless new information warrants revision of the determination before the expiration date or a District Engineer has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.<sup>4</sup>

On January 18, 2023, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of the Army ("the agencies") published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States," 88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) ("2023 Rule"). On September 8, 2023, the agencies published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming", which amended the 2023 Rule to conform to the 2023 Supreme Court decision in *Sackett v. EPA*, 598 U.S., 143 S. Ct. 1322 (2023) ("*Sackett*").

This Memorandum for Record (MFR) constitutes the basis of jurisdiction for a Corps AJD as defined in 33 CFR §331.2. For the purposes of this AJD, we have relied on Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (RHA),<sup>5</sup> the 2023 Rule as amended,

as well as other applicable guidance, relevant case law, and longstanding practice in evaluating jurisdiction.

The subject of this approved jurisdictional determination is an approximate 95-acre site located near 17137 Black Stallion Lane, Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland (39.590657, -77.775654). The parcel is identified on the Maryland Department of Assessments and Taxation Map 56 as Parcel 1085. The site is located within the piedmont physiographic province of Maryland.

# 1. SUMMARY OF CONCLUSIONS.

a. The review area is comprised entirely of dry land (i.e., there are no waters such as streams, rivers, wetlands, lakes, ponds, tidal waters, ditches, and the like in the entire review area and there are no areas that have previously been determined to be jurisdictional under the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 in the review area).

The Corps received a request for a Department of the Army (DA) approved jurisdictional determination on 21 March 2024, for the subject site located near 17137 Black Stallion Lane, Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland. The information provided in the request package supplied by the consultant included a USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service Soil Survey map, USGS topographic map, aerial imagery, USFWS National Wetland Inventory Map, USGS National Hydrography Dataset, a site map, a LIDAR image, and wetland data sheets.

On 5 June 2024, the Corps conducted a site visit and field reviewed the entire approximate 95-acre Corps area of review as identified on the enclosed drawing dated 20 February 2024. The majority of the Corps area of review encompasses land that was previously agricultural, with upland forested lands throughout the site and paved areas with buildings near the center of the site. The Corps observed several rocky outcrops spread throughout the site. The soils on the site are mapped as Duffield Silt Loam, Hagerstown Silt Loam, Hagerstown Silty Clay Loam, Hagerstown Rock Outcrop Complex, Swampond Silt Loam, and Swampond-Funkstown Silt Loams (U.S. Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Service, WebSoil Survey, 2024). These soils and their minor components are classified as non-hydric. The Corps evaluated two soil samples within the area of review and did not observe hydric soil indicators. Based on field observations, supplemental information reviewed by the Corps, and in accordance with the protocol contained within the 1) Eastern Mountains and Piedmont Regional Supplement Version 2.0 and 2) 1987 Corps Delineation Manual, the Corps did not observe hydrophytic vegetation, hydric soils, or

wetland hydrology indicators within the above-mentioned area of review. The Corps determined the Corps area of review includes only dry land and no jurisdictional waters of the U.S.
