The Washington Aqueduct produces drinking water for over one million citizens living, visiting or working in the District of Columbia, Arlington County, Virginia and the City of Falls Church, Virginia. Washington Aqueduct must significantly reduce or eliminate its practice of returning treatment residuals to the Potomac River in order to comply with a permit recently issued by the Environmental Protection Agency. These residuals consist of river sediment and coagulant that are a byproduct of the drinking water treatment process.

The public meeting will include presentations to supplement information presented in previous meetings and will describe new information gathered in the EIS development process. In addition, time will be allotted for public comment as well as for question and answer sessions similar to the previous meeting on September 28, 2004.
